Key Facts and InformationThe 1812War is often referred to as Part of World War II and sometimes the Forgotten War. It was another war between America and Britain. It was caused in part by disagreements over shipping and trade on the high seas. He also struggled to decide how much influence the United States would have in foreign affairs. The War of 1812 can be called the war of bad communication. Two days before the declaration of war, Britain agreed to repeal the naval laws that are primarily responsible for the war. A quick connection would also eliminate the greatest battle, the Battle of New Orleans, which took place 15 days after the signing of the peace treaty. Actual fighting took place in America and Canada. The United States was a whole new country, and leaders risked a national catastrophe going to fight powerful Britain for the second time. Support in the U.S. was divided with the West and South in search of a struggle, but the people of New England strongly opposed the war. As the war continued, the opposition grew much stronger. President Thomas Jefferson wanted to preserve American goods coming abroad, and at the same time prevent America from getting out of foreign wars. Britain and France were at war with each other, as well as much of the rest of Europe. Both sides believed that American ships were supplying each other with food, weapons and other supplies. American ships regularly stopped both France and Great Britain. Everyone demanded to search the cargo holds. Sometimes such situations ended in violence. In 1794, the United States was concerned about the war between France and Britain. The Constitution of the United States, was ratified only three years ago, provides for the introduction of the navy. Fleet, passed a bill to authorize the construction of six Navy ships. One of them was the U.S. Constitution. Despite its nickname, the Old Ironsides was a wooden ship. During the War of 1812, the Constitution sunk a large number of ships belonging to the British Navy. The Constitution earned its nickname Old Iron Sails when a British sailor saw one of his cannonballs hit the wooden hull of the U.S. Constitution, bounced and fell into the sea. In amazement, the sailor said, Hurrah, her sides are made of iron. During the War of 1812, Old Ironsides captured 24 enemy ships. The War of 1812 ended when the Treaty of Ghent was signed at the end of 1814, guaranteeing that the United States and Great Britain were for the end of their battle.
